Also accompanied by many laughing gas capsules ii) a large lorry tyre on Ermin Street by Westfield Road on Brockworth side reference number is FS-Case-134266153 iii) There is a toilet by the Hucclecote entry bridge just down from the Vic. Reported iv) Fly Tipping at rear of Court Road Shops, business owner has discussed with Chair of Committee that he witnessed rubbish being thrown from flats side as previously stated.
