Brockworth News - From Castle Hill Primary School

The term has been a busy one with lots of opportunities created for engaging children in learning. Our Christmas celebrations were particularly memorable for every child for many reasons. For Reception, the opportunity to perform in front of a packed hall in their 'Nativity' was an experience that has helped to build early confidence and an ability to work together as part of a team. They were able to speak with voices that were loud and clear and really enjoy the sense of occasion. This was built on by Year 1 and Year 2 working together to present 'Peter Pan.' Anyone who was there will tell you how wonderful the dancing was. Every child was of equal importance and worked together to retell the story through movement. I even started to believe that some of the children could fly!

We start the New Year with a focus on developing purposeful learning outside the classroom as well as in. Our school is on its way to becoming a 'Forest School.' This will enable the children to participate in activities in our woodland area that generate a feeling of engagement and success. We know already how story writing has developed since the children can make their story plots from practical experiences and the deeper level of learning and self esteem that this brings. Forest School's holistic approach helps us develop the whole child physically, spiritually and emotionally.

The emphasis on insisting on a high expectation of handwriting has ensured that the presentation of children's work is now valued as well as the content. Each child has a book that tracks their writing progress throughout their journey through school. Every child is proud of this record. They look forward to sharing these books with their mums and dads as well as any visitor we get visiting the school. In our most recent prize giving, we are particularly pleased that now it is the boys as well as the girls that are receiving these. Well done to everyone for valuing what a difference it makes when reading something that is neatly written.

This term is short and purposeful. With only 10 weeks before the Easter holidays we aim to support our children develop and learn in areas that will

capture their imagination and ensure school is seen as a fun place to be. Whilst Reception begin their journey into the world of 'Fairytales,' Years 1 and 2 study 'World Kitchen.' Years 3 and 4 are 'Time Travelling'-exploring Brockworth in the past, present and future. Meanwhile, Years 5 and 6 are exploring 'Is it Right to Fight?'This is a topic focussing on life during World War 11. By teaching creatively in the afternoons, our children have the opportunity to apply the skills they learn during Literacy and Numeracy lessons in the morning.
