No special clothes are required but most people find loose clothing and flat shoes most comfortable for practice.

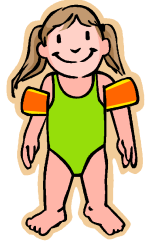

On Saturday 2nd July 2011 Brockworth held its annual fete on the Queen Elizabeth II playing fields at Mill Lane. The weather was very kind to the village.

A dry, sunny, 2nd July saw a very successful Brockworth Parish fete, enjoyed by a large number of people of all ages. The Fete held is annually For and By Brockworth residents. Of course people from outside the village are and were warmly welcomed. It was lovely to have feed back from people who had seen the signs around the village, whose curiosity had been encouraged, and decided to come and see what was going on. (They were impressed by what was going on) There were things to do and see for all age groups and interests. In the main arena we saw the Lassington Oak Morris Dancers, Sheethousestudios, and the Cake Walking Jazz Babies. The Tewkesbury Borough Mayor was shown around by the chairman of the parish Council. The elected mayor was given a large teddy bear for auction at his designated charity.

The children had fun on the fair, climbing wall, sky walk and the bouncy castle (I am sure some of us "oldies" would also have liked a go).

The Scouts Mess Tent provided refreshments and homemade cake, which was well received. The scout leaders were on hand to give information about what was on offer in the scout movement which is open to both boys and girls.

The attractions also included Gloucester Fire and Rescue Service, Police, Art (Dave Ochiltree) this group design the front cover of the parish magazine. Tartagliars Ice cream, candy bar stall, the Red Cross did the first aid cover (fortunately there was no call for their services).

The dog show proved very popular and was in the other ring. The dogs and owners seemed to be enjoying the occasion. There was obedience, best dog etc. There was also an animal photographer taking photos and commissions for your own animal. These photos can be made into key rings, mugs, coasters etc should you wish.

It never ceases to impress me by the wealth of knowledge, skills and activities which are available within our small area. It is so important that we become involved to enable this to continue. The number of stalls was about 30 in total. There were the Martin Pardine martial arts (07917759146) with regular classes within Brockworth. This is a really good way to keep fit, learn new skills, and expend energy. There were some lovely hand made cushions, jewellery, cards, and opportunity to get your nails done, the children could have wash-off tattoos, and you could have your spine checked out by the wellness clinic based in Hucclecote Road.

The Brockworth Parish Council and the Brockworth Community Project were available if you wanted to put your name down for volunteering at the library or youth club, for information on what is potentially happening with regards the future of the village. Plans were being shown about the possible change in the green belt and it is in all our interests to keep up to date on what is happening with the joint core strategy which Tewkesbury Borough, Gloucester and Cheltenham with Stroud on the fringes are all part. In conclusion our July Fete was a great success, thank you to all who attended, to the people involved in the day and in the preparation. I certainly am looking forward to next year.

## **Annual Report 2010/2011**

Welcome to the Annual Report 2010/11 on the activities of the Council. You will find details of how the Council spent its money in 2010/11 and how the Council funds this expenditure.

During the past year, Godfrey Browning sadly died and we welcomed Mrs Fiona Miles onto the Parish Council in December.

The Parish Council consists of 17 councillors who represent an electorate of approximately 6,500. Elections are held once in every four years, the latest one was in May 2011. Details of the new councillors can be found on the last page of the report. Elected councillors received an allowance of £150 each during the year; the allowance covers the cost of printing council papers at home, making phone calls on council business and travel expenses within the area.

The Parish Council employs 3 part-time members of staff to manage Council matters:

## **Good Citizen Award**

In December, Kelly Noble was awarded the Good Citizen Award for her contribution to the community.

## **Community Centre and Coffee Shop**

The building has been open for just over five years and bookings for the main hall and other rooms have increased.

The Coffee Shop in the foyer of the Community Centre is now open Mondays to Fridays 10am to 1.30pm and serves light lunches, refreshments and there is a weekly lunch club for our senior citizens. We are also able to provide all the catering for conferences booked at the Community Centre.

## **Community Bus**

For the past 4 years, Tesco developer grant money paid for a community bus which has been well-used. That money ran out on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2011 and the Parish Council is looking into whether we can obtain some more money to continue the bus.

## **Library and Youth Centre**

Gloucestershire County Council decided to withdraw permanent support to these services and to ensure that these are maintained, the Parish Council has partnered with Brockworth Community Project to take on the running of these two important services. The Parish Council has committed £25,000 to the first year's running costs, and has done so without increasing the Parish Council's portion of the council tax for 2011/12.

## **Citizens Advice Bureau Service**

The Parish Council subsidises the weekly advice service that the Citizen Advice Bureau provide from the Community Centre on Tuesday afternoons. The service is very popular with local residents and appointments can be made through the Community Centre reception. We apologise, but due to the funding restrictions, only Brockworth residents can make use of this free service.

## **Public Rights of Way**

The Parish Council is always looking to ensure Rights of Way are kept clear, notifying Gloucestershire Highways of potholes in roads and pavements and ensuring that litter and dog waste bins are kept emptied and in good condition. Doggie waste bags are available from the Community Centre, free of charge to Brockworth residents. Remember to take proof of address when you collect your doggie bags.

Residents are requested to help keep footpaths and pavements clear of vegetation by making sure your hedges and trees are regularly cut. Pavements should have a minimum 1m width and 2m height clear of vegetation at all times.

## **Parks and Open Spaces**

Brockworth Parish Council has two playing fields – Mill Lane and Pound Farm. There has been some wilful damage to equipment at Mill Lane. If you witness any vandalism, please report the matter to the Police. The Council was fortunate to receive developer funding for the resurfacing of the play areas on Mill Lane. We hope to make improvements to the play area at Pound Farm during the coming year.

The land behind the Shell garage on the A46 has been re-named “Cross Hands Meadow” and a community tree planting event took place last year with 100 trees planted that had been donated by the Woodland Trust. The Parish Council has applied for a further 100 free trees for another community tree planting event later this year.

## **Planning**

Brockworth Parish Council considered 64 planning applications during the past year. There are always difficulties and difference of opinion when considering planning applications, particularly in areas covered by Green Belt and Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The Parish Council is always considered about future housing developments impact on Brockworth roads and other services.

## **Burial Ground**

The Parish Council has extended the burial ground with the purchase of an additional  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre of land. The land has been grass-seeded and a new boundary fence installed. There is a new entrance-way leading from the existing burial ground into the extension. This area will be used for cremated remains in the future.
